But to truly create strong, life-affirming communities,


CPCI must be more than "just" a pregnancy clinic. That's why, in addition to free pregnancy tests, limited ultrasounds and counseling, we also offer free and confidential testing and referral for sexually transmitted infections (STIs) to both women and men throughout our service areas—especially on college campuses, where STI rates have reached an all-time high. Also, through our youth outreach program—SHARE (Sexual Health and Responsibility Education)—we're helping teens understand the importance of abstinence outside of marriage to prevent unplanned pregnancy and protect their health.

As CPCI marks its 45th anniversary this year, we thank God for the continuing chain of compassionate, pro-life individuals who have brought us through challenges, helped us succeed, and enabled the phenomenal growth of CPCI—from its beginning as the fledgling Emergency Pregnancy Services center in Naples...to five professionally staffed medical clinics and and soon to be two mobile medical clinics serving Collier, Hendry, Lee, Sarasota, Manatee, Charlotte, Desoto, and—with the upcoming opening of our University of Florida at Gainesville clinic—Alachua Counties!

COMING SOON: SECOND MOBILE MEDICAL CLINIC

REACHING WOMEN WHEREVER THEY ARE



Through generous funding provided by the Florida Region 5 Knights of Columbus, CPCI was recently blessed with a brand new, second Mobile Medical Clinic, helping us serve more women—and men, too—in outlying rural areas, at abortion clinic sites, on campus, or wherever our services are needed.

Like CPCI's first Mobile Medical Clinic, the new addition is equipped with an ultrasound machine and staffed with a registered diagnostic medical sonographer to conduct free and confidential ultrasounds, pregnancy tests and testing for sexually transmitted

infections (STIs). A well trained volunteer client advocate is also on hand to assist with welcoming clients and assessing their needs. You're likely to see one of our Mobile Medical Clinics tooling down the road and, when you do, honk to show your support for Life.

“Without this clinic, I would never have become a mother.”

Meet Tiana, a professional ballroom dancer and beautiful, new mom with a powerful story to tell. Tiana came to CPCI in late 2017 to confirm her suspected pregnancy. Having recently parted with her boyfriend of 12 years, she was distraught over his cold response to her possible pregnancy—“This isn’t good timing. I really don’t have much to say.” Now Tiana was considering the advice of her brother, a medical doctor: “I would terminate,” he’d said, “otherwise your career is over.”

Tiana’s free pregnancy test at CPCI was positive. Patty, one of CPCI’s registered nurses, listened carefully to her worries and fears. “She knew I was undecided,” remembers Tiana, “but there was no pressure” to keep the baby. Later, during her second visit to CPCI for a free ultrasound, Tiana could see her developing baby’s yolk sac. Before Tiana left the clinic that day, Patty prayed with her and offered assuring words: “You can do this!”



Still, Tiana was torn. She owned a dance studio, which consumed her time. And her dance career was taking Tiana in new and exciting directions. How would she manage a newborn? She scheduled and paid several hundred dollars for an abortion at Planned Parenthood. When she arrived for her appointment, she noticed the

other young women in the waiting room were all looking at their cell phones. “Everyone was embarrassed to be there,” she said. “Clearly, we knew we were not making the right choice. That’s why we wouldn’t look at each other.” Overcome with emotion, Tiana told the receptionist she was leaving and hurried out the door, determined to keep her baby.

Sadly, Tiana miscarried a few weeks later, on Christmas Eve. But this story has a beautiful ending. Through counseling, Tiana and her partner were already reconciling when she lost the baby. In March 2018, she became pregnant again—and this time the couple was ecstatic. Meanwhile, CPCI nurse Patty had been calling Tiana to see how the first pregnancy was progressing. Not ready to talk about it yet, Tiana dodged her calls for months. When she finally shared news of her miscarriage and the new pregnancy, she reminded Patty, “I’ll never forget—when I was here the first time, you told me I could do this....Without this clinic, I would never have become a mother!”
