To Our Valued SHARE-holders:

In 2019, nationally renowned, pro-abstinence speaker Pam Stenzel presented Sexual Health & Relationship Education (SHARE) to **more at-risk youth and young adults than in any previous year** since CPCI began offering the program in 2014. Because of your generous donations, SHARE was able to influence 7,775 lives last year — an increase of 2,400 individuals.

Indeed, the demand for SHARE is underscored by **rising statistics** for unplanned pregnancies and sexually transmitted infections (STIs) in 15-to-24-year-olds. We continue to battle an STI epidemic that reached its all-time-high in 2018¹ and **continues to climb** within a culture that views contraception as “safe sex” and abortion as “contraception”.

SHARE made significant inroads in **Alachua County** last year, as CPCI’s medical clinic in Gainesville began engaging the 76,000 abortion-vulnerable young adult students enrolled at the University of Florida and nearby Santa Fe College. Hard-hitting statistics and SHARE’s “safe sex is NO sex before marriage” message were presented to **1,200 students — 24 times the students reached in 2018!** — from faith-based campus organizations, including Catholic Gators, Lutheran Church Missouri Synod Students, FOCUS and Students for Life, as well as from area church groups and high schools.

Meanwhile, SHARE presentations in **Lee County**, home of CPCI’s Fort Myers medical clinic, **nearly tripled** — from 850 in 2018 to 2,300 last year — as we reached more area church and school groups than in years past. As always, **parents were also strongly encouraged to attend**, and many tell us the experience helped open up a whole new level of communication between them and their teens.

Finally, we worked to **increase public awareness** of the toxic culture and SHARE’s potential to change it by presenting information to state legislators and 1,875 adults, including 400 attendees of the State Conference for Pregnancy Care Centers and Clinics.

Because of your investment in SHARE, you are helping today’s young adults and teens understand the risks involved, make responsible choices, and avoid needing to deal with an unplanned pregnancy or STI! **Thank you for your prayers and support!**
